Born in 1943, he began Japanese ink paintings in 1965. Former Vice Chairman of the Japan Ink Painting Association and the Contemporary Japanese Ink Painting Association. He has won numerous Japanese ink painting exhibitions, including the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology Award and the Minister of Foreign Affairs Award.

Graduated from the Department of Painting, Faculty of Art, Joshibi University of Art and Design, majoring in Japanese painting. She is a board member of the Contemporary Japanese Ink Painting Association. Since being selected for the first time in 2002 for the Contemporary Japanese Ink Painting Association's 'Gensui Exhibition', she has won many awards at the same exhibition. She was chosen to appear in the Suntory Gin 'SUI' web commercial in 2024.
